WHY WE RECOGNIZE ROMANTIC REJECTION-RELATED HOMICIDES



Violence Free Minnesota has been tracking domestic violence homicides since 1989. In addition to domestic violence homicides, we recognize deaths that are not domestic violence-related, but which occur as the result of misogyny and systems of violence against women.

These deaths include homicides of individuals killed as a result of a perpetrator's refusal to accept romantic rejection, as in Kayli's case. Unless there was a prior or existing romantic or sexual relationship, we do not view these deaths as domestic violence-related, but we do view them as a result of misogyny and male entitlement, which contribute to unacceptable levels of violence against women.

We do not view Kayli's homicide as an intimate partner homicide, as she was not in a romantic or sexual relationship with the man who killed her and repeatedly refused one, which he chose not to accept. We recognize her homicide under this romantic rejection criteria.
