1971, a group of women began a program in Minneapolis offering 24-hour crisis lines, support groups, and a mechanism for victims/survivors, volunteers, and communities to speak out about sexual violence. In 1978, the Minnesota Coalition Against Sexual Assault was born as a grassroots group of member programs sharing resources and support. MNCASA was incorporated in 1982 and continues its work to prevent and address sexual violence today.

MNCASA also houses the Sexual Violence Justice Institute, a state and national technical assistance provider.
